STAPYLTON'S environmentally friendly industrial development by Bruce Mitchell has attracted interest from industry leaders.

A group of leaders toured the site on Tuesday. Among the group was head of the Mirvac School of Sustainable Development at Bond University Professor George Earl and Urban Development Institute of

Australia sustainable development officer Kirsty Chessher. Prof Earl said the project "opens up a whole new field of water management". "There is a quantum shift in this area. We're starting

to see it in master-planned communities," he said. "It should have been done 20 years ago, but we have to start somewhere." The \$8 million project was the first industrial subdivision in Australia to

exclusively use in-house water and sewage systems. Water from roads and recycled water from sewage treatment is used to water the native gardens. Roof water is stored for potable use.

# Kiernan puts out call to help in clean-up day

ONE million Australians are needed to help fight climate change as part of the 2007 Clean Up Australia Day campaign. Clean Up Australia chairman Ian Kiernan said individual action to protect water supplies, improve recycling of electronic

waste and limit damage by plastic bags would reduce greenhouse gas emissions. "Toxic materials from electronic or e-waste, which includes lead and mercury from old computers and batteries, is being sent to landfill at three times the rate of other general or

municipal waste and generates damaging greenhouse gases," he said. Mr Kiernan hopes to involve one million people in the March 4 event, an increase on last year's number of 750,000. Beaudesert Shire residents are being
